## THIS MORNING:

One of the first lessons we learn growing up is that life's not fair. "That's not fair!" is what every child says when he doesn't get his way, or sees someone else receiving a benefit he would like to have. As a child, we get upset over things like a cookie, a toy, or a trip to the ice cream store. As we get older, we discover that the "fairness" issues take a higher toll – I get a ticket, even though there are hundreds of other cars doing the same speed; I lose \$50,000 because the housing market dropped six months after I bought my house; I miss out on the job offer because I happened to be on holidays when the company called.

But there is another level of unfairness, called injustice. That's when the rules are overturned by powerful people to favour a few privileged individuals, and the powerless ones who live at the low end of the totem pole have their rights, their property, and even their lives taken away from them. We know that the world is full of injustice. The story of Elijah that we will look at today is an account of a gross injustice that was foisted upon a single, righteous and innocent man, Naboth by name. We will see as we look at it, that injustice is the same today as it was 3000 years ago. But there is a God who sees, and who will set things right in the end.
